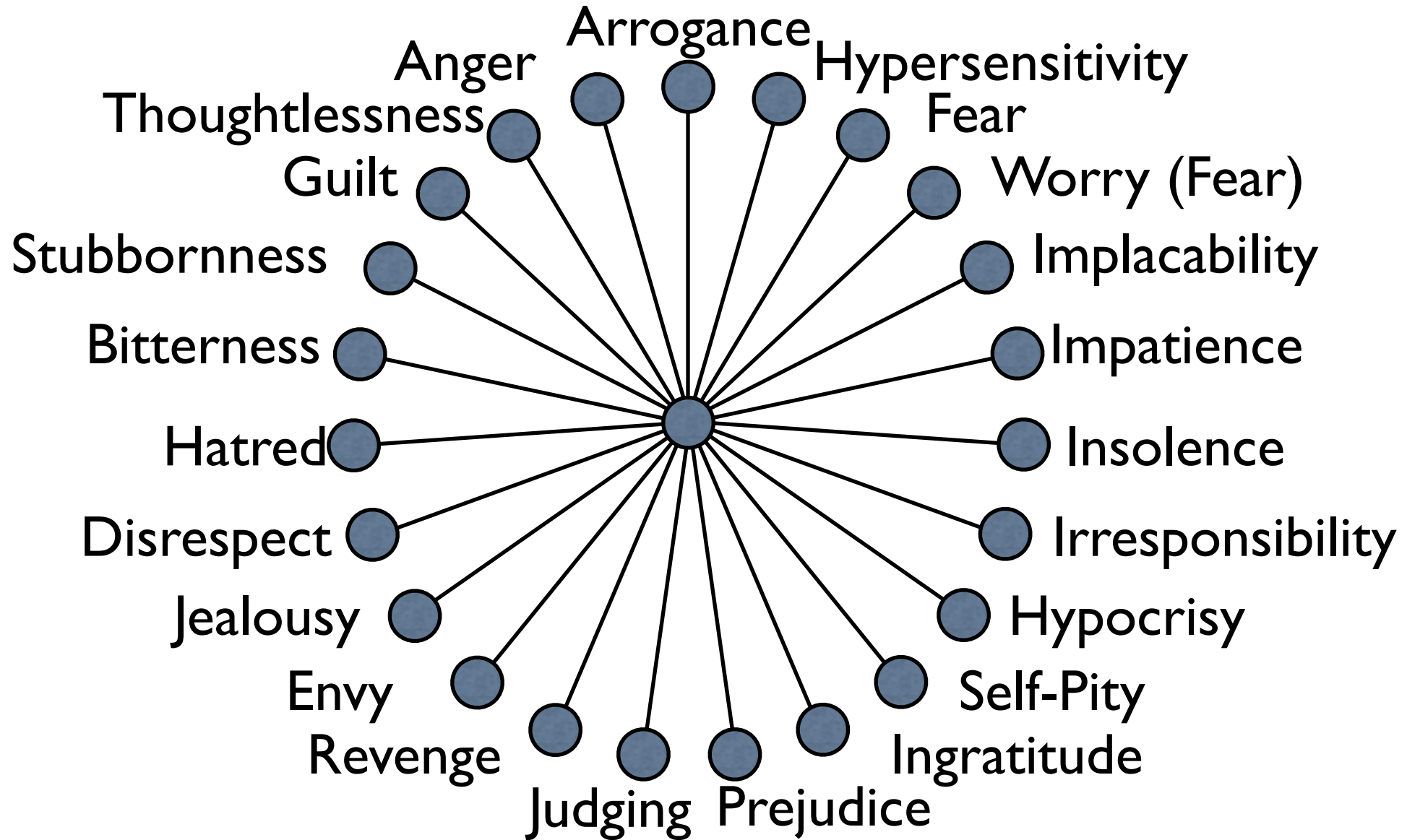


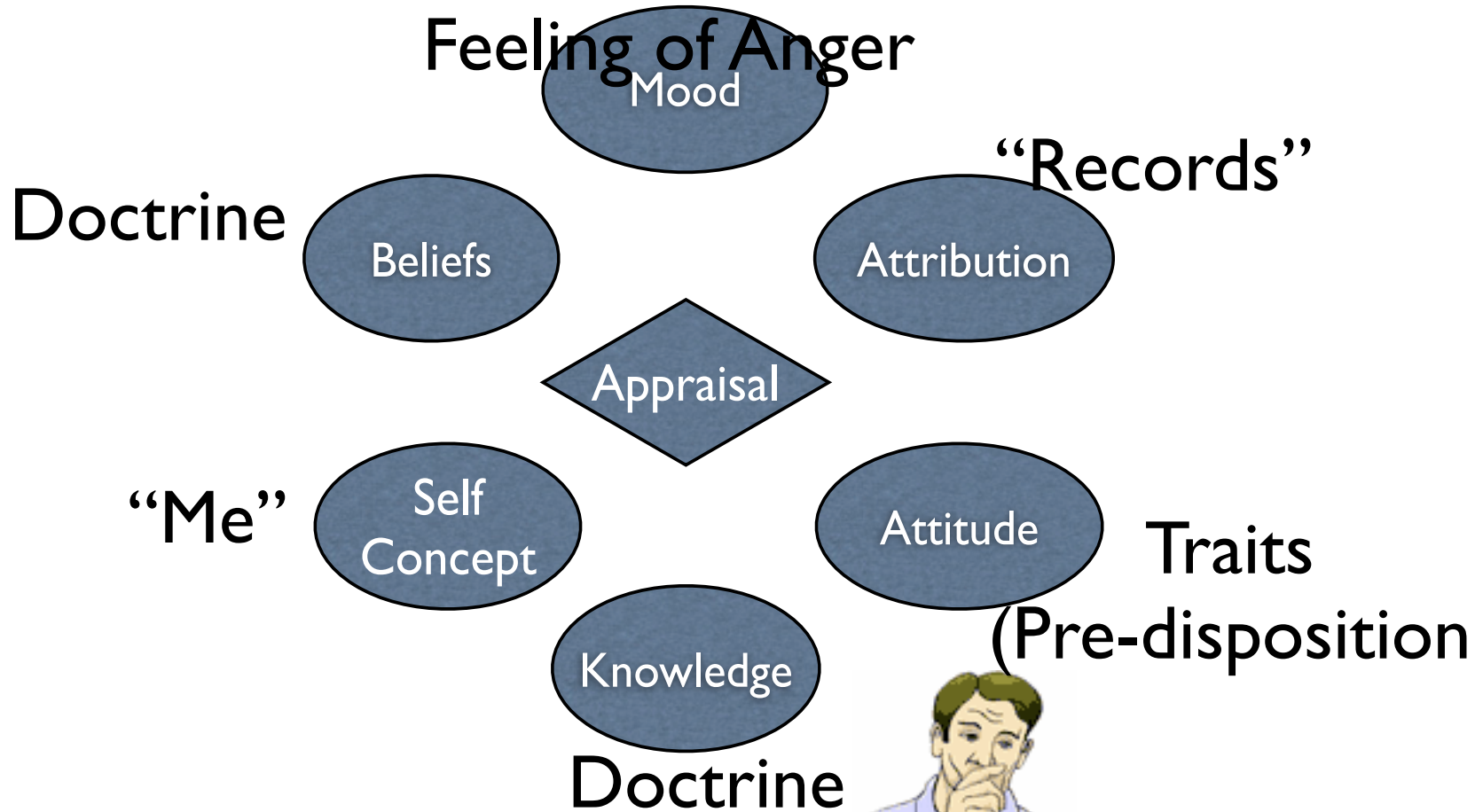

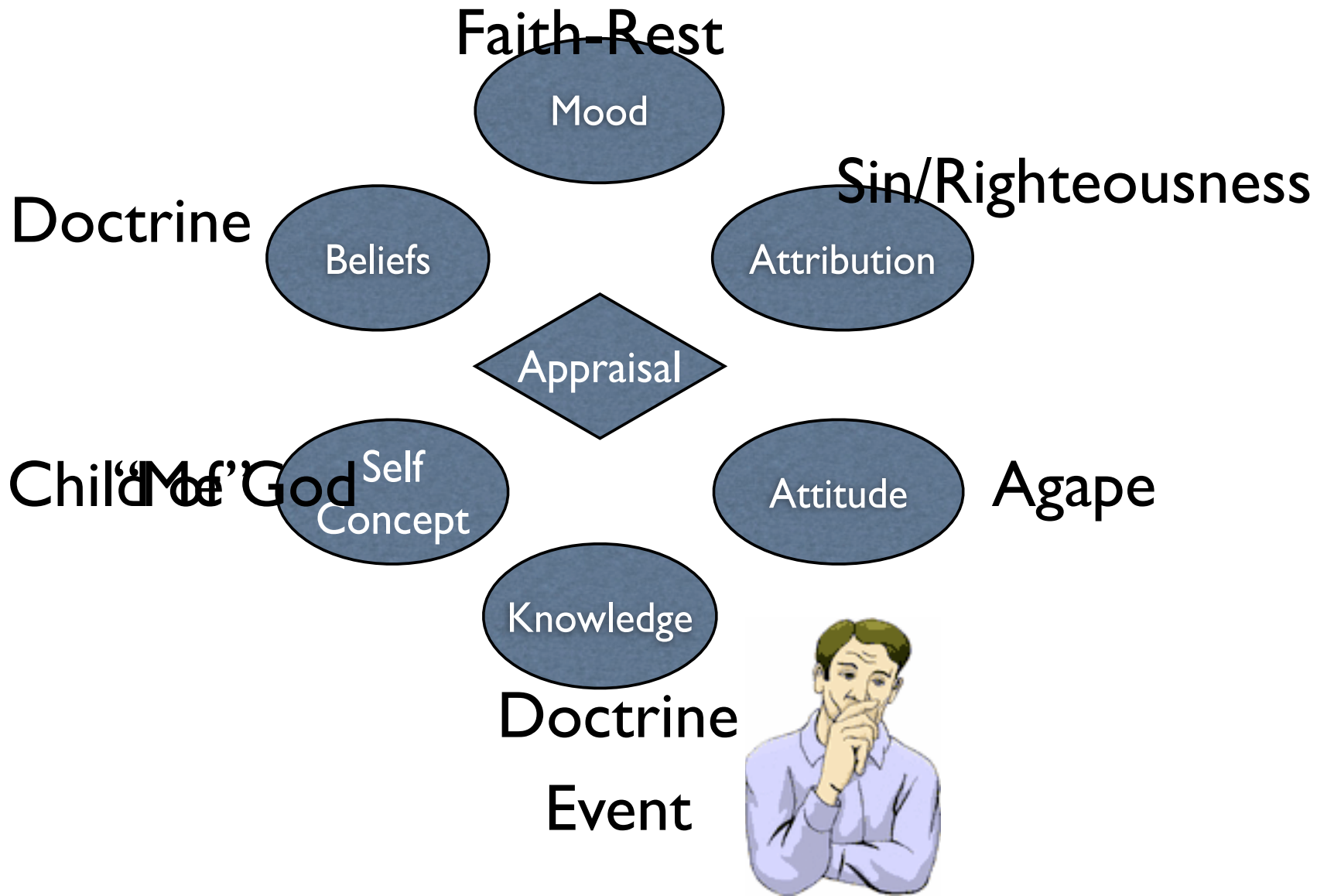

HAT 22: Anger

- Righteous Indignation
- Anger which does not destroy the virtue of the subject is classified as righteous indignation.
- Righteous Indignation uses the Standard of Doctrine, not Human Values
- Unconditional love maintains the virtue of the subject, but sinful anger destroys the function of unconditional love.
- Believers must be careful not to have emotional sins of anger and call them righteous indignation.

Righteous Indignation Appraisal



HAT 22: Anger

- Righteous indignation does not seek revenge or try to get even.
- It recognizes that two wrongs do not make a right.
- Sinful anger always motivates a cluster of more sins.
- Mark 10:14 gives us an account of our Lord's righteous indignation when His disciples tried to keep children away from Him. When Jesus said this, He was "indignant" . . .
- Christ expressed righteous indignation with regard to the Scribes and Pharisees in Matt. 23:13 – 36

HAT 22: Anger

- Mark 3:5 – And after looking around at them with anger (ORGE) . . . This is referring to our Lord as He looked at legalistic unbelievers with righteous indignation as they were rebuking Him for healing on the Sabbath.

HAT 22: Anger

- Anger as an anthropopathism - ascribing to God a human characteristic that He does not possess in order to communicate to man divine policy of Righteous Indignation:
- “The anger of the Lord” – Num. 25:24, 32:14, Deut. 29:20, Judges 2:14, 3:8, 10:7, II Kings 24:20, Lam. 4:16, Jer. 4:8, 25:37, 30:24, 51:45
- “The wrath of God” – II Chr. 28:11, Ezra 10:14, Psa. 78:31, John 3:36, Rom. 1:18, Eph. 5:6, Col. 3:6, Rev. 14:10, & 19, 15:1 & 7, 16:1, 19:15

HAT 22: Anger

- Critical areas where one must NEVER lose his cool:
- Marriage - Verbally attacking your spouse around others.
- Children - Disciplining your children when you are angry.
- Rage – Using a weapon to get even.

HAT 22: Anger

- anger - *a strong emotion; a feeling that is oriented toward some real or supposed grievance*

HAT 22: Anger

- anger - the state of being angry - Attitude
- Category Tree:
- state
 - ⊔ physiological state
 - ⊔ arousal
 - ⊔ emotional arousal
 - ⊔ anger, angriness
 - ⊔ rage

Arrogance

- Arrogance, haughtiness, highhandedness, lordliness - *overbearing pride evidenced by a superior manner toward others (inferiors or perceived inferiors).*

HAT 23: Arrogance

- James 4:6 - God gives more [greater] grace. This is why the Scripture says [Proverbs 3:34], 'God makes war against the arrogant [believer], but He gives grace to the humble [believer].'
- God makes war on any arrogant believer who is in Satan's army, one of his disciples.

HAT 23: Arrogance

- 1 Pet. 5:5-6 - In the same way, comparative novices, be under the authority of the pastors. All of you in the congregation, fasten yourselves to each other with humility [grace thinking], because 'God makes war against the arrogant, but He gives grace to the humble.' Therefore, humble yourselves [become grace oriented] under the mighty hand of God, that He may promote you at the proper time."

HAT 23: Arrogance

- The more you become preoccupied with yourself the more you allow arrogance in your soul.
- Self-centered people fall into the arrogant traps of self-justification, self-deception, and self-absorption.
- These three forms of arrogance result in unrealistic expectation, fomenting increased desire for Power, Approbation, Materialism, Chemical and Sexual Pleasure, or Religion.

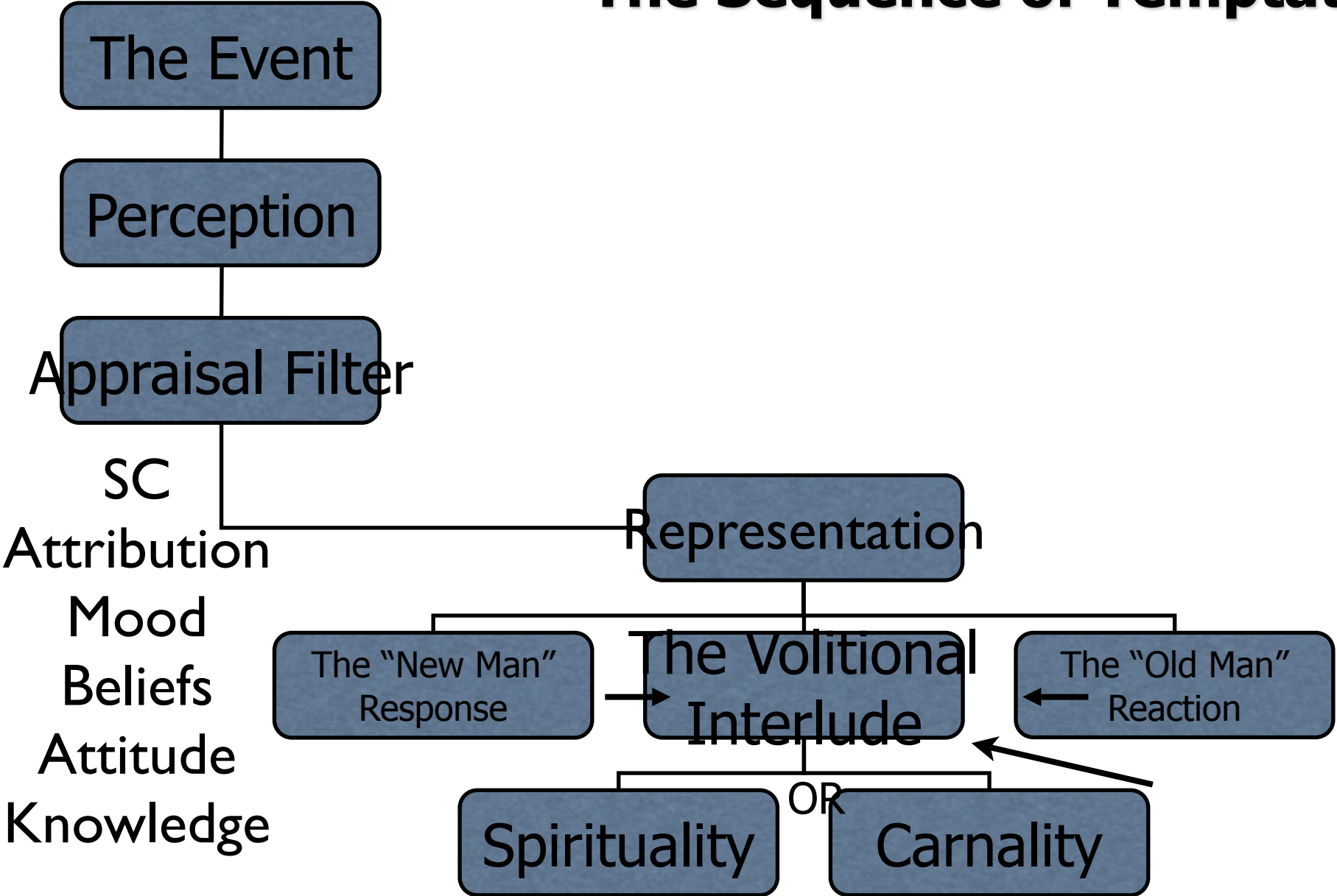
HAT 23: Arrogance

- Self- deception - Level 2 Arrogance
- Self-absorption - Level 3 Arrogance

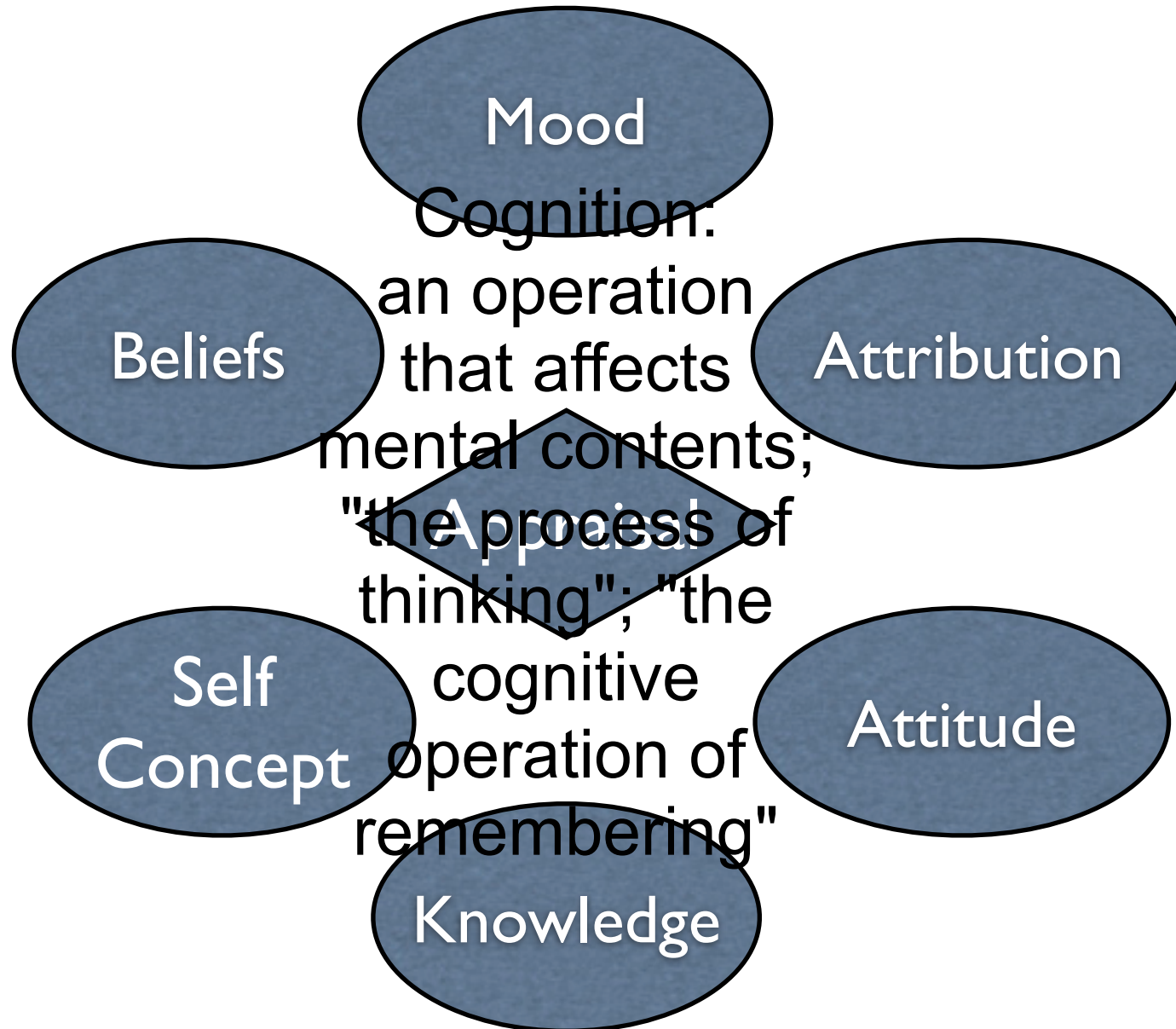
HAT 23: Arrogance

- Arrogance is expressed in:
- Self Righteousness (I am the Standard)
- Judging (I am the Judge)
- Stubbornness (I am Never Wrong)
- Insolence (I matter, you do not)
- and, since Arrogance is the outward expression of Selfism through The Pride of Life Motivators, it will gradually express all of the HAT's.

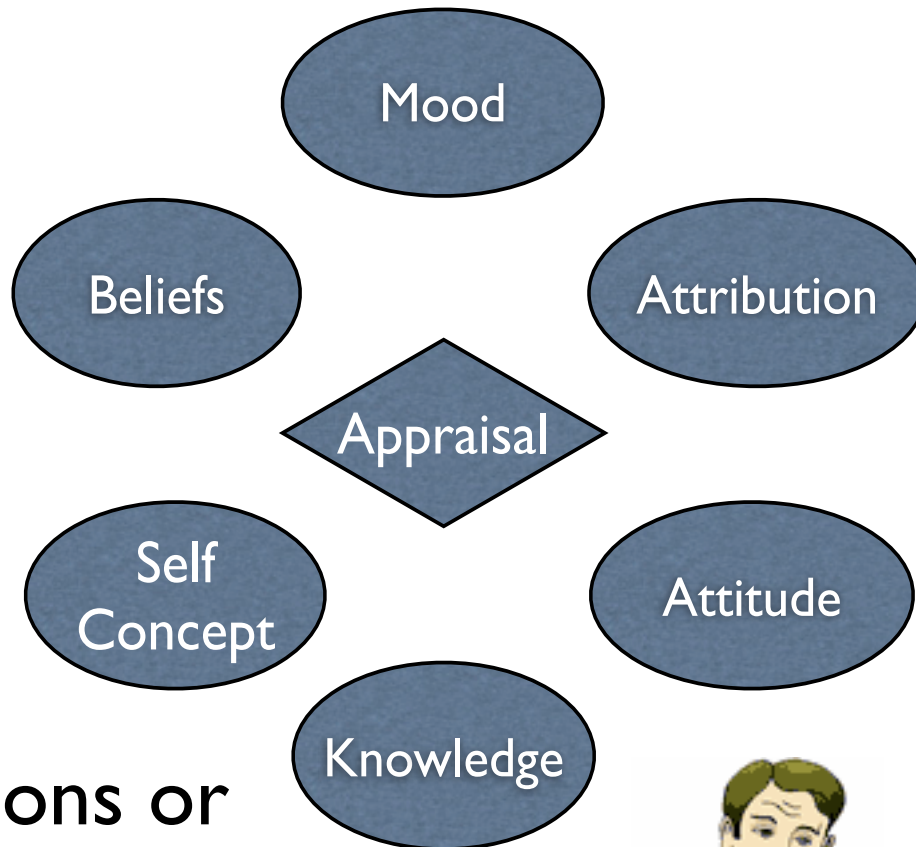
The Sequence of Temptation

HAT 23: Arrogance

- Category Tree:
- Generalization - *the process of formulating general concepts by abstracting common properties of instances.*
 - ℒAttribute - *a generalization belonging to or characteristic of an entity*
 - ℒTrait - *a distinguishing feature of your personal nature*
 - ℒPride - *inordinate self-esteem; the trait of being spurred on by a dislike of falling below your standards.*
 - ℒExpressed as Arrogance, haughtiness, highhandedness

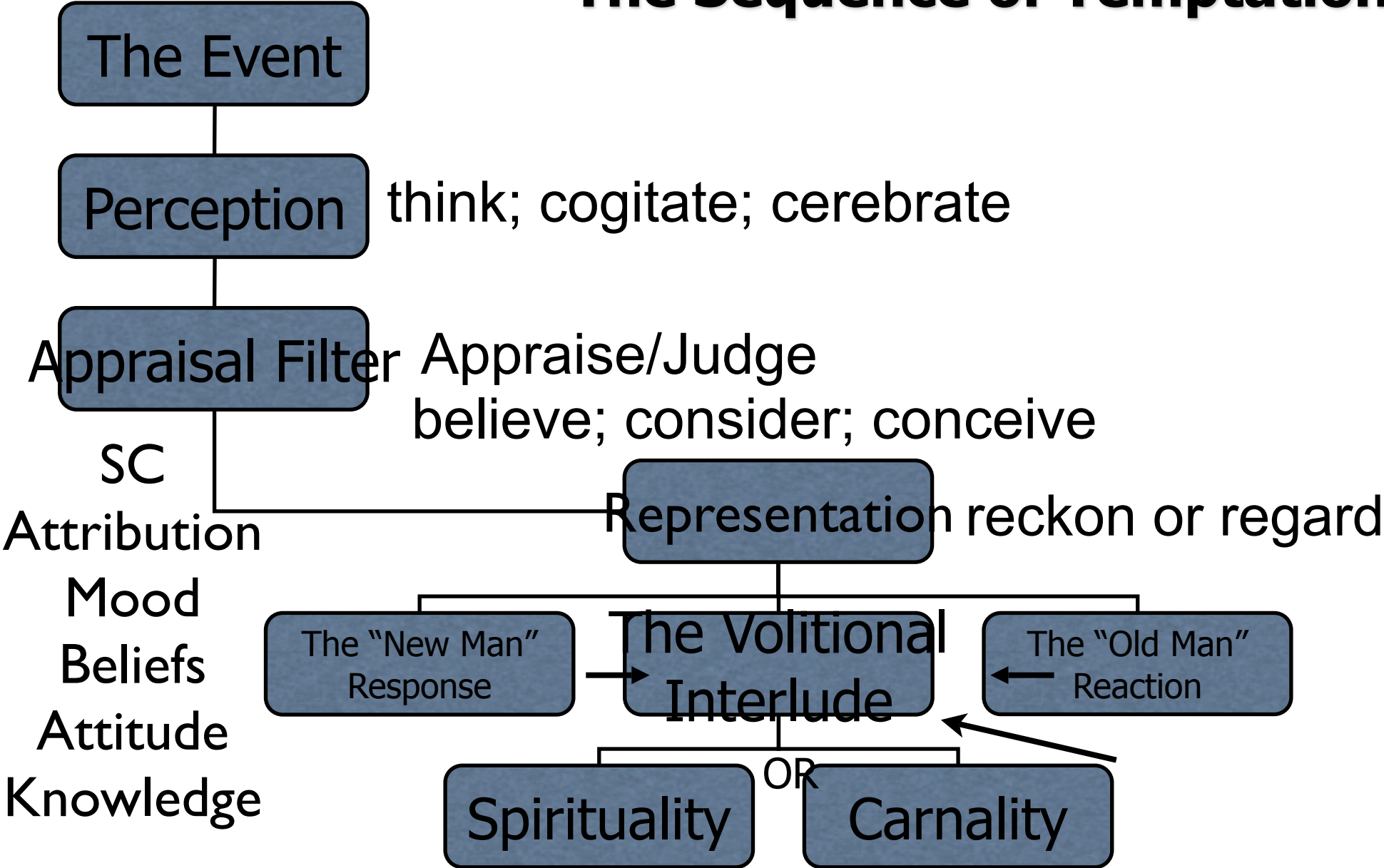

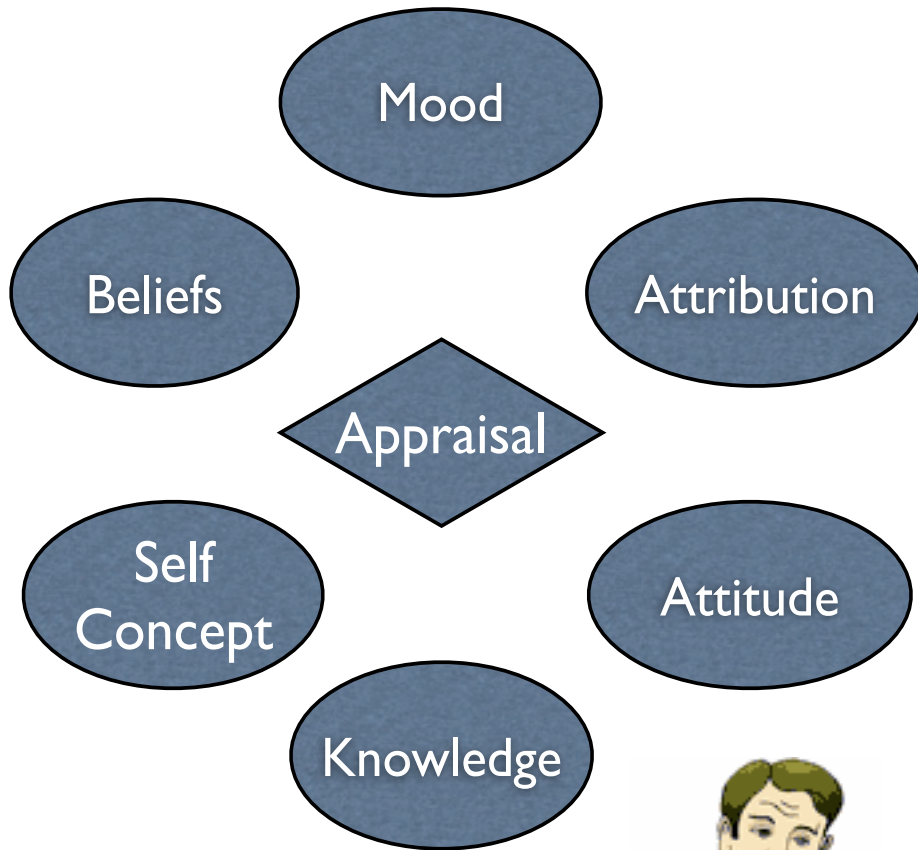
A Lifestyle of Arrogance

The Sequence of Temptation



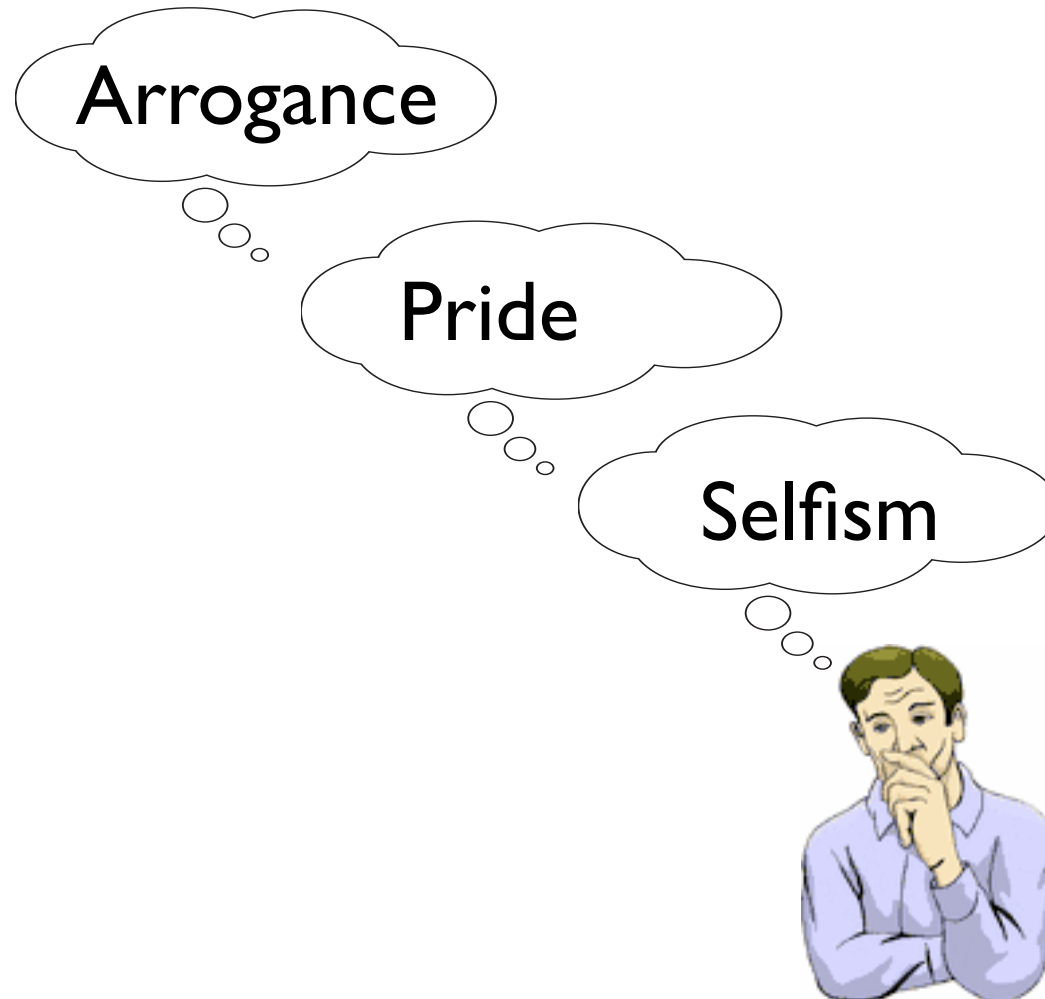

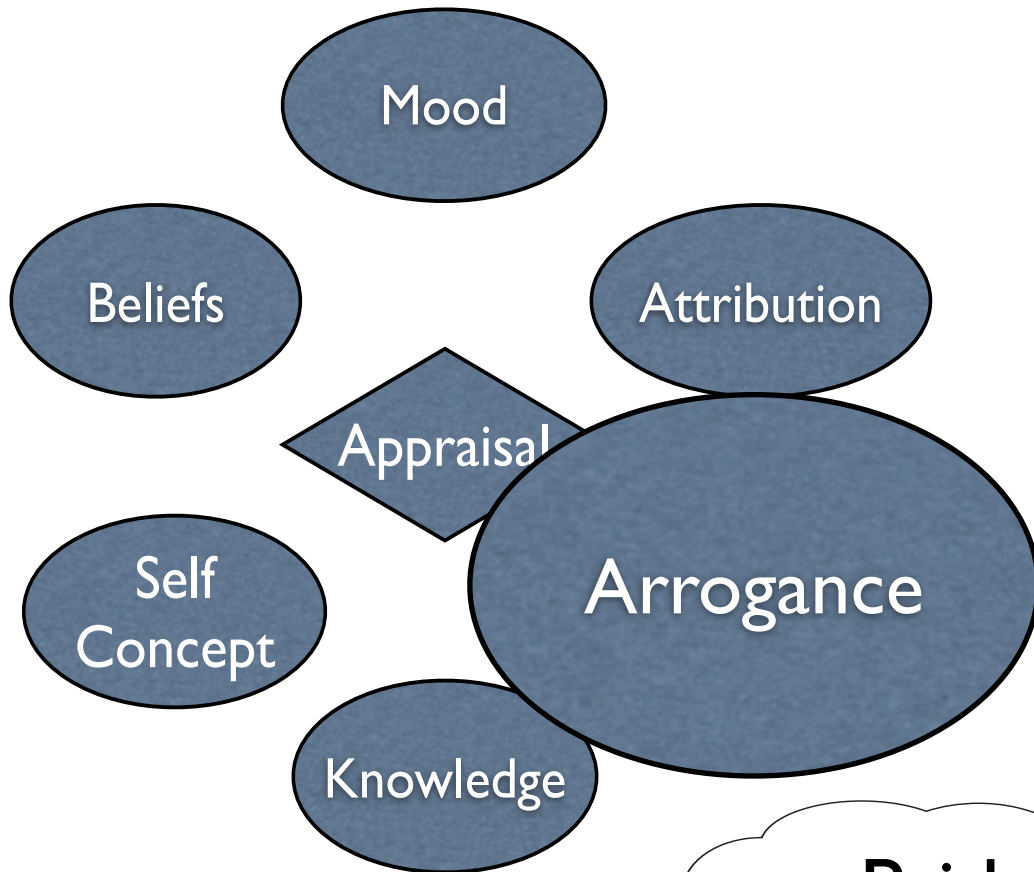
